

# What is VOTE-COPE?

VOTE-COPE is the Committee on Political Education, the non-partisan political action arm of New York State United Teachers. Funded entirely by voluntary contributions from members, VOTE-COPE is used to help union-backed candidates and campaign committees that support education and labor.

VOTE-COPE helps strengthen political action programs on all levels — national, state and local. To help on the local level, VOTE-COPE provide's rebates to participating unions for local political action.



VOTE-COPE funds, by law, are kept separate from those of NYSUT. Decisions on the use of VOTE-COPE contributions are made by a statewide committee.

VOTE-COPE solicits and accepts only voluntary contributions.

Contributions or gifts to VOTE-COPE are not tax-deductible.

Those of you that filled out the paper to donate to Vote Cope back in September should be seeing it deducted from your checks now. You can give as little as 25 cents per pay check. Your building rep can get you the paper to fill out .The BCUEA can get a rebate to fund our own political actions. The more that participate the more we can get back.

### Hall of Fame offers NYSUT members special BOGO tickets

Educators from across New York State will be all-stars when the National Baseball Hall of Fame in Cooperstown celebrates NYSUT members during the Hall of Fame Classic in May.

As a special thank you for their commitment to public education, the HOF is offering NYSUT members buy one, get one free tickets.

NYSUT members can purchase up to six regular-priced Classic tickets and receive six tickets of equal value. Tickets for the Hall of Fame Classic are \$12.50 for first- and third-base seats and \$11 for general admission outfield seats. The Classic, the annual legends game at historic Doubleday Field, takes place at 1:05 p.m. Saturday, May 28, with a special recognition for NYSUT members during the game. A home run contest begins at noon.

Hall of Famers Phil Niekro and Ozzie Smith return as team captains and managers. They will be joined by four Hall of Famers: Andre Dawson, Ryne Sandberg and two more to be announced. Each will serve as coaches for the teams. The full roster of Classic players will be announced later this spring.
